OPPL Renovation Project



flexible spaces to accommodate the patrons' needs without compromising the beauty and openness of the building.

With this in mind, original architect Michael C. Barnes and the architectural team from Wight & Co. are repurposing spaces in many public areas to offer more study rooms, a larger program room, an updated computer lab, a sensory room, a mother's room, an improved preschool area, a teen room, a tween space and more. The Board of Library Trustees have been saving money over

the past decade to pay for these renovations without further taxing the Orland Park residents. This project is estimated at just over \$3 million and the anticipated timeline of this project is October, 2019 through August, 2020. The Library is eager to start this project and will use various forms of communication to keep patrons up-to-date on the progression of the project and the time frame of what areas will be under construction. We anticipate that the library will remain open for the duration of the construction period.

RENEWING OUR STORY

The library is proud to be the "jewel" of the community with extensive services, a spacious facility and a diverse collection of resources supported by a knowledgeable and friendly staff. Since the award-winning building opened in 2004, the Board of Library Trustees and staff understood that providing a contemporary space and the latest materials and technology was of utmost importance. Times change quickly, and the library is used by patrons much differently than years ago. The library has become a center for community engagement and learning.
