

1. Use computer printed designs for your stickers. We provided you with some to choose from for today's project, but you can also print up your own.



2. Cut out your pictures. Don't worry about leaving white around the edges. That won't show on your final sticker.



3. Cut a piece of clear packing tape large enough to cover your entire cut-out design. Place the tape sticky side down on the front of your design. Press down on the design so the tape adheres completely to the picture. Try to avoid picking the tape back up off of the picture. Also try to avoid bubbles.



4. Use a coin, id card, fingernail or something else hard to press on the front of the sticker and rub the surface so that the tape starts to bind with the ink on the paper. Continue for a couple minutes to ensure that the ink and adhesive become one.



5. Run your sticker under warm water with the paper side facing the water stream. Do this until the paper begins to fall off. Don't worry, the ink won't wash away. The paper however, should completely dissolve. Use your fingers and nails to gently scrape off any paper that doesn't come off on its own.



6. Once all the paper is gone, let your sticker completely dry. The tape's adhesive will become sticky again. Use scissors to trim away extra tape.

7. Once dry, stick your sticker to the surface of your choice. If you're not ready to stick it on something yet, put it on parchment paper or wax paper to save for later.
